## Polio Project Options 1950s

**Option 1**: Create a timeline of polio featuring at least 10 events. Timelines can be general or can specific to one or more factors:

- General timeline with a variety of information
- Focusing on a theme (research, social aspects, or treatment)
- Focus on a person (poster children, Peg Kehret, FDR, or other)
- You need to sign up for one of these to avoid repetition.

**Option 2**: Show the statistical impact of Polio in any 3 ways from the list below:

- Geographically Where did polio strike in this country and around the world? Focus on one "outbreak" and show this with a colored map with legend. You may want to address what is happening globally today.
- Over time **When** were the worst outbreaks? Can you compare the different epidemics using a graph?
- Demographics of polio **Who** was affected by polio?
- Show through a graphic, **How** successful different treatments for polio patients were.

Graphs need to include labeled axes, a key, a short interpretation and a title, and be neat and clear. Graphs should be original (don't print one from the web!)

**Option 3**: Create a Venn diagram and Write an essay - Compare the original "March of Dimes" campaign in the 1950s US to global polio eradication programs of today. Using the attached rubric to guide your writing.

## **Option 4**: Polio and Primary Sources –

- 1. Examine the selected primary source documents related to polio posted on the bulletin board.
- 2. Select one document and sign up for that document with Mr. Fortier
- 3. Record your observations (what do you see, what does the document tell you)
- 4. Consider this document from different points of view and respond in a letter to the editor. See the writing rubric attached.
